How Much Can "Trash Bag" Hold?

"Trash Bag" can hold a MAX of 3,000 Lbs. How much is that exactly you ask?

Some examples for reference.

- 47 sheets of drywall (4' x 8', ½" thick)
- 1,280 sq ft of hardwood flooring (¾" thick)
- 180 wood or metal wall studs
- 1 cubic yard (1/3 of bag) of heavy materials like brick, concrete, dirt, rock, sand, sod or stucco


Where and when can I use "Trash Bag"?

Trash Bag is perfect for small to medium home, business and construction projects that your normal trash service can't handle, but doesn't require a full-size dumpster. Suitable jobs might include:

- Renovations & Cleanouts
- Attic & Garage Cleanouts
- Yard Cleanups
- Deck Removal

- Bathroom Renovation
- Kitchen Renovation
- Bedroom Remodels

- 1. Unfold "Trash Bag"
- 2. Create ridged sides by standing inside "Trash Bag" and folding sides out and halfway down.
- 3. Fill "Trash Bag", placing heaviest materials in bottom.
- Bring sides up as you fill being sure to keep handles outside of bag and accessible



I've filled my "Trash Bag". Now what?

- 1. Schedule-Schedule your collection by calling 305-451-2900. Provide the collection address, the location of the TRASH bag on the property and the contents. Location must be accessible by Grapple Truck.
- 2. Pay-Driver can accept your cash or check payment at pick up, sorry no credit cards taken on-site. You are welcome to pay with Visa or MasterCard in our office. We can also email you a form to process your Visa or Master Card payment.
- Relax-We'll come pick up your Trash bag on date scheduled. If you have a
 conflict or need to cancel, simply give us a call.
